

Hungry 4 Success Training is a pre-employment program designed to bridge individual skills gaps, identify potential barriers to employment and/or further education and support those enrolled with building a solid foundation of soft skills; communication for the workplace, teamwork, negotiation, compromise etc. We work with the individuals to tailor a pathway plan ensuring a range of supports is provided along the way. Glen Park have a strong relationship with both Glad Group and Eastland (QIC) and our Hungry 4 Success Program is their preference to source employees for their organisation. Just in this current intake; we have seen 3 out of 9 learners gain sustainable and suitable long term employment with an employer that understands some of the barriers that individuals may face.

The program runs for 10 weeks (totaling 20 sessions) and has a 2 day a week commitment and has multiple intakes throughout the year. This program is funded through the Department of Education and Training but there is a \$90 out of pocket fee for the 10 week course. Hungry 4 Success Training also includes "A Day in the Life" Trade Taster in one of 5 trades; cleaning, security, guest services, maintenance (with our partner Glad Group) and hospitality with our on-site social enterprise, Café on the Park. Trade Tasters are a onceoff 3-hour session of hands on training and learning in their chosen trade. Throughout the Hungry 4 Success program we have a Skills and Job Centre attend to deliver workshops on resumes and cover letters, interview skills and mock interviews, and provide job readiness work-shops. We will also be offering one-on-one career planning with a careers counsellor and offer learners an opportunity to meet with a Jobs Victoria Advocate.

	Some employers have little experience in employing people with a disability and are concerned they might ask the wrong questions. An employer can reasonably ask questions about the impact of a person's disability if it relates to how the person would perform the 'inherent requirements' of the job and to work out if workplace adjustments or support might be needed. To identify the inherent requirements of the job, focus on the end result of the work you need done rather than how you usually do it.

Employers may be eligible for funding to cover the costs of workplace adjustments or other financial assistance. NDIS funding is required to attend these programs
